- 3. The following orders were made:
 - service of this application is dispensed with; (a)

the convening period in the administration of ADVANCED BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION LIMITED ("Company"), as defined in section 239AT(2) of the Companies Act 1993 ("Act") is extended to 10 August 2021 (an extension of 90 days) under section 239AT(3) of the Act;

- the period of time in which the applicants are required to give notice of (b) termination of a contract of employment under s 239Y(3) of the Act is extended under s 239Y(4) of the Act to an end date of 10 August 2021, instead of 14 April 2021;
- the Administrators may convene a watershed meeting in respect of any (c) of the Company at any time within the period for which the extension has been granted;
- (d) leave to apply is granted to any person who can demonstrate a sufficient interest to modify or discharge the above orders, upon appropriate notice being given to the applicants;
