1. The without notice originating application made by **IAN BRUCE SHEPHARD** and **JESSICA KELLOW** on the 19 day of April 2021 was determined by the ~~Honourable Justice~~ *Associate Judge Johnston* on the *22nd* day of *April*, 2021.
2. The determination was made without a hearing.
3. The following orders were made:
  - (a) service of this application is dispensed with;  
  
the convening period in the administration of **ADVANCED BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION LIMITED ("Company")**, as defined in section 239AT(2) of the Companies Act 1993 ("**Act**") is extended to 10 August 2021 (an extension of 90 days) under section 239AT(3) of the Act;
  - (b) the period of time in which the applicants are required to give notice of termination of a contract of employment under s 239Y(3) of the Act is extended under s 239Y(4) of the Act to an end date of 10 August 2021, instead of 14 April 2021;
  - (c) the Administrators may convene a watershed meeting in respect of any of the Company at any time within the period for which the extension has been granted;
  - (d) leave to apply is granted to any person who can demonstrate a sufficient interest to modify or discharge the above orders, upon appropriate notice being given to the applicants;
  - (e) within seven days of the Court's orders the applicants must:
    - (1) advertise the orders once in *The New Zealand Herald*, and *Dominion Post*;
    - (2) post a copy of the orders on BDO's and the Company's website;
  - (f) that the costs of this application be paid out of the assets of the Company; and
  - (g) such other orders as the Court deems appropriate.
